

A Brief History of First Christian Church

First Christian Church was organized and started as a Bible study in the home of Mr. and Mrs. James Cunningham in Ashton Township. As the size of the meetings grew, they were moved to the home of B. C. Holbrook in Onawa. God continued to bless this group and in 1897 a contract was signed for the construction of a new church building on 10th and Diamond. The building was dedicated on Sunday, January 8, 1898. The congregation was informed at the dedication that the new building was totally paid for and that the congregation was free from any debt. (The total construction cost was around \$7,000.00).

As the years passed, the congregation continued to grow. It became evident that the building was not able to meet the needs of the current congregation. In 1966, land was purchased from the McElroy family and a new building was erected. In March, 1967, old and new came together as the congregation held its first worship service in the new structure on 15th Street.

As we remember our history, we look back and we give thanks for the sacrifices that so many people have made for the cause of Christ and for the growth of His Kingdom. But we also look forward as we commit ourselves to the same purpose and the same mission as the saints who have gone on before us.

Our mission is to L.I.G.H.T. the way to life. We are striving to Love God and to love others; to Include Saints in meaningful fellowship; to Grow in maturity as Christ followers; to Help those who are helpless and in need, all giving us an opportunity to tell about the good news of Jesus and about the redeeming work of his precious blood. Let us continue the work!








We don't simply want to "come to church." We are striving to "be the church."






